GLOBAL MARKETS HIGHLIGHTS

AUSTRALIA: The Australian market was closed for the Queen's Birthday public holiday in most states.

NEW YORK: US stocks extended their recent rally into the new week, with optimism growing that the gradual easing of COVID-19 lockdowns is proving successful. The S&P 500 and Dow Jones Industrial Average climbed +0.7% and +1.1% respectively, while the Nasdaq Composite added +0.8% and hit a fresh intraday record high. Gilead Sciences (+0.7%) was in focus after reports over the weekend that AstraZeneca (-2.7%) made a preliminary approach regarding a potential merger, although the report said the companies weren't in formal talks. Industries that were savaged by COVID-19, such as airlines and oil majors, were among the best performing sectors. Boeing shares surged +11.9% after a brokerage report said the worst case scenario was already priced in and upgraded its rating on the stock. In the oil industry, Halliburton (+11.9%), Marathon Oil (+10.7%) and Schlumberger (+5.7%) led the way.

LONDON: European stocks were hit by a spot of profit taking in Europe, with equities slipping marginally lower as investors capitalised on last week's impressive rally. A European Central Bank policymaker said the ECB has not yet discussed buying equities, but the option remains on the table. The Stoxx Europe 600 fell -0.3%. LVMH declined -2.0%. Roche lost -1.3%.

HONG KONG: Asian markets got the opportunity to react to Friday's positive US jobs surprise and equity rally. The Nikkei 225 (+1.4%), Shanghai Composite (+0.2%) and Kospi (+0.1%) rose, while the Hang Seng remained unchanged.

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
